POSITION SUMMARY

Provides trauma-informed recovery focused therapy and assessment with survivors of domestic, intimate partner and sexual violence in individual, family and group settings. This includes the evaluation of mental health needs, establishing a treatment plan and related clinical goals and objectives. Provides crisis intervention and emergency clinical support for survivors as needed.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Implements effective trauma-informed therapy and recovery techniques for survivors and their families who have been victims of domestic violence, intimate partner abuse, and sexual assault; often in crisis situations.
2. Meets utilization and productivity standards as defined by the agency.
3. Provides mental health assessment; utilizing current DSM, MSE, and ancillary tools as appropriate within industry standards and best practices.
4. Develops Individual Service Plan (ISP) in conjunction with the client to reflect the survivor’s voice, choices, and preferences
5. Provides Clinical Supports in individual, family and group settings that reflect trauma-informed approaches and are survivor empowerment focused.
6. Teams with the CPST workers, Victim Advocates, Emergency Shelter Program, and others to provide a continuum of care that supports the survivor toward empowerment and recovery.
7. Attends Interdisciplinary Team (IDT) meetings routinely; provides case status/update to assist in ensuring continuity of care and problem/solution toward survivor empowerment and recovery goals.

8. Attends clinical supervision sessions as necessary and assigned.
9. Documents client activities, intake interview, progress notes, goals and objectives, 90-day updates, evaluations and terminations in a manner consistent with quality assurance guidelines, OHMAS regulations and COA standards.
10. Makes referrals to appropriate agencies and resources in keeping with client needs and agency policy and procedure.
11. Maintains the rights and confidentiality of all clients at all times.
12. Performs other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Requires a Master's Degree in Counseling or Social Work and be Independently Licensed in good standing with the appropriate state licensure board. Prior experience working with domestic violence, intimate partner abuse and sexual assault issues preferred; can provide a demonstrated knowledge of trauma-informed responses and approaches; experience working with an electronic health record a plus. Excellent written and oral communication and strong organization and problem solving skills. Must have a positive attitude and the ability to interact well with clients, staff, volunteers, and the public.

Work is moderately active. May require sitting for long periods of time. May require lifting up to 50 pounds.
